### **Class Acts: Tips on Course Success**

#### **Setting the Stage**

- Have a set place to study. Keep it Spartan and use an upright chair and desk.
- ♣ Plan out your time. This will take away the anxiety of having things always "hanging over your head." Just be sure to follow through.
- Work one hour and then give yourself a break. When you work, work. When you play, play.
- Exercise and sleep enhance performance.

#### **Knowing the Program**

- Make it a priority to attend class, especially if you are an auditory learner.
- Look up what you do not know. Do not be unsure of anything or pretend to know when you do not.
- "Read between the lines" for the implied idea.
- Critical thinking respects evidence and is true to rules of logic, interpretation and method.
- Own your education. It will be a valuable asset.

#### **Following the Director**

- ♣ Make sure you follow directions (as always, the most important rule in school).
- Go over the syllabus carefully at the start.
- Read the text and struggle with homework. This sets up questions to be satisfied in class.
- ♣ Be sure of your assignments. If in doubt, ask.
- ♣ If a teacher recommends the Learning Center or The Write Place, take advantage of free help.

#### Learning the Script

- ♣ You can rent textbooks or get them through iBooks.
- Look up words and vary your word choice.
- Skim the text and form questions.
- Try to picture in your mind what you read.
- Explain things back to yourself at the end.
- Underline important information.
- Star (\*) unusually good thoughts or ideas.
- Number series or sequences ((1,2,3).
- {Bracket complete explanations}.
- Put a question mark (?) next to things that do not make sense right now.
- If pressed for time, read the first sentence of the paragraphs and skim the rest.

#### **Practicing the Part**

- Use technology to schedule and complete work.
- Get work done as soon as possible.
- Consolidate everything into one set of notes in terms you understand.
- Go over your class notes every day.
- Have questions ready for class that arise from the reading.

#### Performing the Role

- When asking spontaneous questions, think about what will be helpful for all at that moment.
- ♣ Use the left 1/3 of the page for the general idea, the right 2/3 for details. Use outline form with space at the bottom to write questions.
- Fold notes and go back and forth when studying.
- When studying for a test, predict what the teacher will ask and answer these questions.
- Treat each question one at a time. A journey is composed of small steps.
- On multiple choice tests, go with your "gut" first guess. Change this only for good reason.
- On essay tests, be careful to answer the question, and just the question. Dump facts and ideas and then group them; get your answer; form an outline; then write.
- Use extra time to check over your work.
- Correct all your tests. This reinforces your knowledge and helps ace the final.

#### Writing the Review

- When choosing a research topic, ask a focused question for which you can find an answer.
- ♣ Answer with a clear thesis. This unifies things.
- Be clear and focused when entering terms into indices, databases, and search engines.
- Start a paper with a catchy introduction. Put your most powerful point last.
- Use the conclusion to summarize and compel the reader to explore further.
- Do not use the same "big" word twice in the same vicinity, unless for rhetorical effect.
- Repetition, alliteration and parallelism provide rhythm and balance to your writing.
- Keep sentences "short and sweet."
- ♣ Say the most with the least. This is concision.
- Be sure to cite what belongs to another.
- ♣ Become familiar with citation formats (MLA, APA)
- Only use "you" (2nd person) when speaking or writing to someone.

#### **Supporting the Cast**

- ♣ Helping each other succeed makes friends.
- Form study groups, especially for online classes.
- Personal interaction is key to success.
- Find a friend to quiz each other, but resist the hype before an exam.

#### Taking a Bow

- ♣ Don't get bent out of shape on performance.
- ♣ Analyze your mistakes. Reward your success.
- ♣ Please let your tutor or writing consultant know how things went with your efforts with them.
- Remember what worked well and build on it.
